EBU panel TD ranks

This table aims to give a rough idea of what various ranks of TD should be able to do, or which events they might run, as a guide to helping you decide whether you think you are ready for promotion. If you do think you would like to apply for promotion, please contact either the Chief TD or the Chair of the TDDG. There are no quotas or vacancies – TDs are promoted when they indicate they would like promotion and demonstrate they are suitable. In all instances the qualities needed are additional to those required at lower levels.

Flexibility is important, and so you could find yourself in charge of something that is indicated below as appropriate for someone of a higher rank. If you do, and think you have done a good job, it might well indicate to you that it is the right time to think about applying for promotion.

Since the flourishing of online bridge brought on by the COVID pandemic, all new TDs and those looking for promotion are expected to be familiar with online bridge as well as face-to-face, and willing to work in both types of event as necessary.
