North may only have five points but 5-card support and a 6-5-1-1 distribution should ensure that he bids 3♦, and then even thinks about pushing on to 5♦ over 4♠ despite the adverse vulnerability. Now it is easy for South to raise his partner's suit. If North's 1♠ only shows four cards, over East's 2♥ South should be able to distinguish between a three and four card raise in spades in that many players use double in this situation to show 3-card support. Those who haven't got this weapon available will just have to settle with bidding 2♠. Come what may, with all that distribution and two aces, North should have the courage to drive on to game. 4♠ should make but continued trump leads by the defence make it very uncomfortable for declarer. If he simply leaps to 4NT, Roman Key-Card Blackwood will show that North has two aces and the ♠K and then 6♠ will be the inevitable resting place. It is possible that West will open the bidding, particularly if East-West are playing a 2NT opening to show a minor 2-suiter. If West passes then North’s 1♥ opening gives South the choice of responding 2♥ or 1NT. I prefer 2♥ over which West surely will bid an unusual 2NT; now North should double to show a good hand but what will he do when 3♣ is passed round to him? Now West could try a competitive double (to show at least a genuine raise to 2♠) or an unassuming cue bid of 3♦ (to show at least a genuine raise to 3♠), or even an over optimistic raise to 4♠. East has a difficult choice to make over partner's 2♠ rebid: 3♣ should be regarded as constructive so it is a possibility, as is 2NT despite the rather thin holding in the red suits. If West passes as dealer then so will North, leaving East free to start with 1♣. Now North can double to show the red suits when West bids 1♠ and 2♣ will probably end the auction. Any West playing Michael's Cue Bids will be tempted to bid 2♣ to show 5-5 in the majors even though his spades could be a little stronger. Now it seems reasonable for North to raise to 3♣ and East to show a fit for both majors by bidding 4♣, followed by South going to the 5-level. Raising hearts looks the best course of action, though 2♥ does seem a little conservative; however 3♥ just looks wrong if you are playing 4-card majors. 1NT is the alternative: this may prove the lucky choice if North overstates his hand by bidding 3♣ over West's 2♠ as now South will surely bid 4♥. 4♥ can always be made, though on continued trump leads it almost requires being able to see through the back of the cards. Should partner rebid 2♦ rather than raise spades, West would face an impossible rebid as 3♣ would certainly show a 5-card suit and the rather dreadful 3NT rebid would produce a forlorn final resting place if North finds a diamond lead (even a heart lead only produces ten tricks which will be outscored by 4♠). After the more sensible start of 1♦-2♣-2♦ West still has the unenviable rebid of 2♠ on four small (what else can he do?) which will result in 4♠ being reached. If he does West will certainly raise him to the doomed game. If East passes, South's 3♦ should come round to him and now if East bids 3♥ it should produce a plus score, either by being the final contract or by driving South on to 4♦.
