## Triangular matches

After two sessions of play, the winners only are deemed to be undefeated and assume the lowest of the three team numbers for the purpose of the next round draw.
The second placed team assumes the middle of the three team numbers for the next round draw; the third placed team assumes the highest of the numbers. Second and third placed teams are both deemed to be once defeated: no team is totally eliminated as a consequence of having played in a triangle.

## Head-to-head matches

The teams in the head-to-head matches will play a 32-board match on Friday night and another on Saturday morning. The losing teams from the first match will play each other so that at the end of the second match there will be nine twice-defeated teams who will then play a three-session round robin for qualification to the Punchbowl (top team qualifies).

## SPRING FOURSOMES

## Two-session Triangles

## 1 Format

21 teams, referred to as Red, White and Blue, will play 32-board matches against each other. Matches are played in stanzas of 8 , although the nature of the movement is such that teams cannot score up until 16 boards have been played, i.e. 8 boards against each opposing team.

## 2 Seating rights

There are no seating rights; each team must write down its proposed line-up before the start of a 16-board set. The movement will then operate as follows:
N/S pairs remain stationary throughout the 16-board set.

| For the first 8-board set: | The Red team E/W pairs $\rightarrow$ White E/W <br> The White team E/W pairs $\rightarrow$ Blue E/W |

It follows that the N/S pairs play the opponents in the opposite order, ie:
Red N/S play against the Blue team first, then the White team.
White N/S play against the Red team first, then the Blue team.
Blue N/S play against the White team first, then the Red team.

## 3 Teams of 5 or 6

Teams of 5 or 6 may give advance notice on their line-up slip that they intend to swap one player or one pair after precisely 8 of the 16 boards. No changes other than this are allowed.

## 4 Method of scoring

The basic method of scoring is by virtue of matches won (a draw is a half win). In the event of all three teams winning one match and losing the other, then net imps over all matches played will decide.
If two teams are tied in terms of the basic method of scoring and have also drawn their particular matches, they will play a 4-board play-off in order to determine their precise ranking. The EBU White Book contains full details of various other split ties which might occur - full details are available on request.

## 5 Ranking

The winners of the triangle will be deemed to be undefeated and will acquire the lowest of the three team numbers involved for the purpose of the next round draw.
The second and third placed teams will both be deemed to be once defeated. The second placed team will acquire the middle of the three team numbers for the purpose of the next round draw; the third placed team will acquire the highest number.
Thus, there is a theoretical advantage in finishing second rather than third because those teams who are runnersup would play against third-placed teams rather than runners-up from other triangles in the next round of the once-defeated pool.

## 6 Concessions

a) Any team in arrears in a triangular match may elect to concede both of its matches to its opponents. However, it may not concede to one team and not to the other, save as may be provided for below.
b) A pair of teams, both of whom are in arrears, may mutually agree to concede their match to the third team, but continue their own match in order to determine second place in the group.
c) No concessions other than these are allowed.

## 7 Master Points

1 Green Point per player per match won, subject to that player having played at least one-third of the boards in the match in question.
