# Roadmap to the Blue Book and White Book for online bridge

February 2024 – updated for Blue Book 2023

# 0 Introduction

#### 0.1 General

This book (the *Sky-Blue Book*) consists of EBU regulations and interpretations for online bridge competitions organised by the EBU. It is written to supplement the *Laws of Duplicate Bridge* (2017), The EBU *Blue Book* and The EBU *White Book* where the provisions of those laws and regulations are not applicable for online bridge. The title was chosen to reflect the mixture of *Blue* and *White* and the notion of bridge in the cloud(s).

The current scope of this book is for EBU events, where the EBU is the tournament organiser, and has been agreed by the Chief Tournament Director. Some sections are only relevant to pairs events or events played specifically on BBO.

The Laws of Duplicate Bridge are written and promulgated by the World Bridge Federation's Laws Committee (WBFLC). There is an earlier law book for online bridge, which the EBU has not adopted.

This book was begun in April 2020 and is effective from May 2020. The contents of the Sky-Blue Book from January 2022 have been merged into the Blue Book and White Book in September 2022. This document is a roadmap to where the material can now be found.

# 0.2 Acknowledgements

This *Sky-Blue Book* is published by the EBU: edited by the Deputy Chief Tournament Director and approved by the Chief Tournament Director. There has been input from the EBU Tournament Directors who are running the online games, and from members of the Laws and Ethics committee.
