South Notts Bridge Group - Beginner Training initiative started in Q4 2017

(For the EBU Workshop led by Tim Anderson on 16th November 2022)

Who are we?

- 4 EBU Affiliated clubs in Rushcliffe, Nottinghamshire
- West Bridgford, East Bridgford, Phoenix (Ruddington) & Keyworth
- Memberships of 50-120. Insufficient scale of resources in each club
- Similar issues and challenges

Why did we start?

- Falling member numbers
- Virtually No new members
- Lack of local training in Rushcliffe- more centralised in Nottingham
- Not much evidence of promotion of the game by EBU or NCBA
- Disappearance of local evening classes etc.
- We thought we could target audiences. Retirees and mature workers.
- No clear syllabus. Existing courses were too long! 2+ years

How we did it

- 4-6 key motivated champions across all 4 clubs
- We recognised the need for promotion through publicity and events
- Advertised in local free press to promote seminars in local Libraries etc
- Created flyers and posters, plus EBU promotional posters were helpful.
- Money- we had none but obtained backing from the County and Club chairmen £500
- Agreed a plan and recruited helpers- Communicated
- Used EBED training to upskill trainers to spread the load
- Added Mervyn Jones who developed tech training material with MS PowerPoint
- Got lucky. Found the new EBED Fast Track Syllabus- 24 hrs of tuition!!!!?
- Created the course to run over 12 weeks from late Jan 2018 daytimes with 2nd course midsummer to run over 2 weekends to target employed and busy people!! A challenge.
- Targeted costs and pricing to break even at £95 per person inclusive of EBED Fast Track book
- Found good facilities at reasonable prices but limited trainees to 16 per course
- Recruited 4 members per session to coach and support each table during exercises and play

What we learnt

- Lots but reviewed by surveys and questionnaires
- There was demand. The model worked
- Still difficult to progress students to clubs- too big a gap
- Attitudes of some members were intimidating
- Introduced some parallel No Fear sessions.
- Realised 12 lessons was a minimum- extended practical experience in 2018-2020 at cost

- It was profitable so returned grant funding to NCBA
- COVID 19 severely interrupted progress course 5 was run on ZOOM and BBO!! Half continued
- We produced signposting to students on how to continue their Bridge journeys
- Our effort to take learning to schools was a good experience but again curtailed due to COVID
- Over 60% trainees rated good or excellent and iterated
- We shared our experience and knowledge with groups from Leicestershire and Staffordshire
- We developed a significant financial surplus!
- The current chairman, former chairman and financial controller of Keyworth are former students

What Next?

- We agreed to resume efforts in mid-2022 for the Autumn
- It was agreed that classroom sessions were best v. Online.
- RealBridge might be a good contender going forward but effort and skills needed
- It was agreed to extend 12 lessons to 3 hours for more practical bid and play time
- We found a good venue and increased the class size to 20 trainees- reducing fees by 30%
- Our assistants returned. MBJ did a great job and we did not need to advertise or run seminars/promo workshops
- The EBU issued corrections to the Fast Track syllabus but no new content
- We need to developed sheltered sessions for beginners confidence
- We believe we have a model that works for many and hope to run 1 or 2 courses per year from 2023
- Plus an improver or Intermediate Level course?
- Increase the conversion of trainees to club members and restore the social sides of the Game and club.
