## CUPS AND TOURNAMENTS

THE following five tournaments are con-  
ducted annually under National Bridge  
Association auspices :

### 1.—THE TOLLEMACHE CUP (Presented by the President)

The Tollemache Cup is played for annually  
by teams of four of British nationality resident  
in the British Isles. The competition is on  
the "knock-out" basis, and is played under  
duplicate rules, matches consisting of thirty-  
two boards. The closing date for entries for  
this season's Cup will be November 15th next.

### 2. THE PAIRS GOBLETS

The Pairs Goblets will be played for annually  
by pairs resident in the British Isles. Entries

for this year's competition will close on May  
30th next. The competition will be on the  
"knock-out" basis, a match consisting of  
eight rubbers.

### 3.—THE LADY MILNE CUP (Presented by the Lady Milne)

The Lady Milne Cup is played for annually  
by teams of four of ladies resident in the British  
Isles. The competition is on the same basis  
as the Tollemache Cup, and entries for this  
season's Cup will close on November 15th  
next.

### 4.—THE DRAKE BOWL (Presented by the Marquise de Dumas)

The competition is for teams of four. All  
teams shall be eligible, except that no player  
shall be included in a team if he or she has  
played in the current year's semi-finals or finals  
in the following events : (a) The Tollemache  
Cup ; (b) The Lady Milne Cup ; (c) The Port-  
land Club Cup ; (d) The Gold Cup. The  
competition is on the "knock-out" basis, and  
is played under duplicate rules, matches con-  
sisting of thirty-two boards.

### 5.—THE PACHABO CUP (Presented by Mr. A. E. Whitelaw)

A County Championship for the Pachabo  
Cup has been organised by the National Bridge  
Association. Each county entering for the  
Cup will arrange a County tournament for the  
purpose of selecting a representative team of  
four. All persons desiring to enter for their  
County tournament must send in their names  
not later than November 15th.

The County tournaments will be conducted  
on the knock-out basis, each match consisting  
of thirty-two boards. The winning teams of  
each County will assemble in London in the  
second week in March for the County Cham-  
pionship. The winning County will hold the  
Pachabo Cup for a period of one year, and each  
member of the winning team will receive a  
replica of the Cup.

County secretaries and those who would be  
willing to act as such should communicate with  
the Hon. Secretary, N.B.A., Savoy Hotel,  
giving suggestions, etc. A percentage of the  
non-member subscriptions will be retained for  
the local secretaries' expenses. It is intended
