- The ideal web site reflects the character of your club. Friendly? Welcoming? Up to date? Is it active at all?

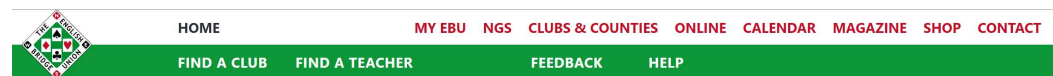
Search engine optimization

- Nothing to worry about but ...
- Write the things that you want search engines to find
- Fresh and up to date content helps too

Learn bridge now!

- The game of bridge urgently needs new players and younger players
- The EBU would love to see every web site guide enquirers towards learning the game

- If a club wants to start teaching – we want to help them!

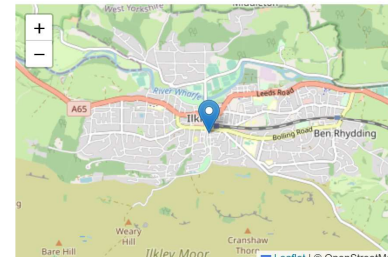
Friendly club in Ilkley, West Yorkshire. We have both f2f and on line sessions suitable for a wide range of players.

How to learn bridge

There are two aspects to learning bridge. The first is to learn the game (or refresh your memory, if you have played before) on a course. The second is to play, whether online or face to face.

If you would like to do a course, we can arrange that. The English Bridge Union, the national body for bridge in England, has a service that will help you enroll on a course starting soon. All the details are [here](#).

As soon as possible we will also help you to start playing at a level suitable for you. You can join our novice sessions, which run on Fridays at 2pm - 4pm, by calling xxx xxx or emailing novice@thisbridgeclub.co.uk. If that time does not work for you, you can also play online with the EBU.

Tips for your web site one: Your key messages

- Identify your key messages
 - Is the bridge club active?
 - What is the schedule of forthcoming events?
 - Where are the results?
 - Where does the club play? What do I need to do in order to attend?
 - How can I learn bridge here?
- Put key messages or links to them “above the fold”

Tips for web sites two: test on mobile

- Every web browser has tools built in for testing web sites
- On Chrome, Edge and Firefox, press F12
- On Apple Safari, use the Develop menu
- You don't need to understand the technical details! Just try "Device emulation" to see what it looks like on small screens
- It can be a bit of a shock!

Tips for web sites three: be short and punchy!

- Attention spans are short
- Use short sentences and short paragraphs for clarity. Cut out words that do not add meaning
- Pictures are great – especially good pictures! Crop photos to focus on the main subject (Windows Paint is great!).
- Ruthlessly purge anything out of date

Tips for web sites four: Design matters

- Not many of us are fantastic web designers. Do not worry!
- Do not paste content from Word! It rarely works out well.
- Paste into Notepad (Mac: TextEdit set to plain text) to remove formatting
- Avoid very long lines (hard to read) or anything that needs horizontal scrolling
- Take advantage of the “themes” available in your web platform. Probably better than we can do on our own!
- Use common sense. Readable? Looks good?

Summary

- Take the web site seriously. It does make a difference!
- Identify key messages and make them stand out
- Test on smartphones and tablets
- Have a prominent and effective “Learn bridge” offer
- Keep working at it, it is not like printed material as you can change it any time!
